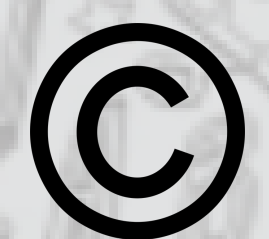

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NOUN

- A word that is the name of a thing, an idea, a place or a person. The first letter of a noun word is always capital.



OBJECTIVES

- These activities will help the students understand and learn about nouns.





PRE-ASSESSMENT



- Ask the students to define Noun
- Ask the students to categorize the noun words



PRE-REQUISITES

- Scissors
- Glue
- Colors
- Color paper
- Eraser
- Big cardboard box(to keep the chits)
- Ruled sheets



ACTIVITY-1

- Students will take a sheet and write 3-5 complete sentences
- Now all these sheets will be collected by the teacher
- The sheets will be distributed randomly so that none of the students get their own sheet
- Now each student will take the given sheet and underline the nouns in every sentence
- Now with all the nouns from the sentences the students will draw a scene in a new sheet which includes all the nouns

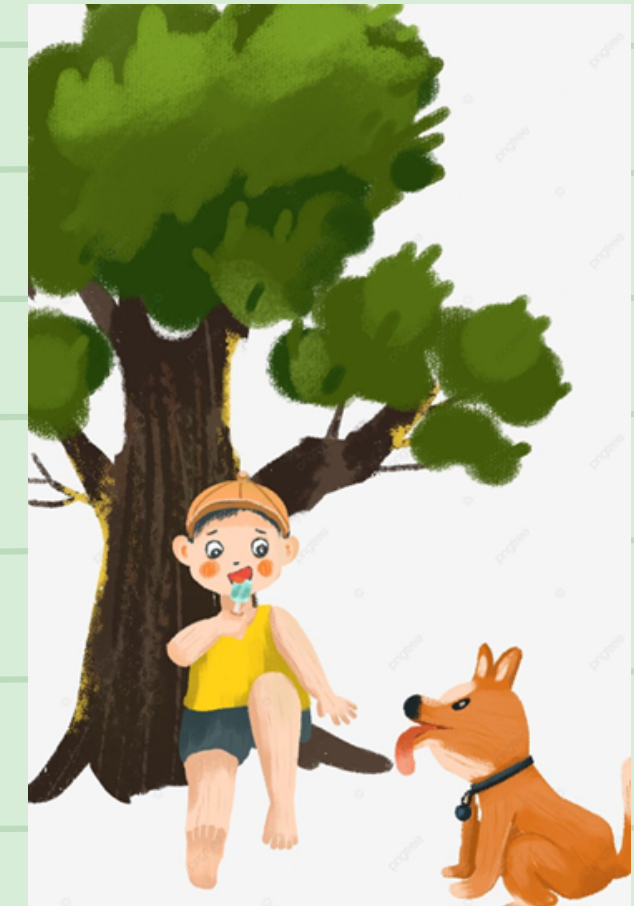


ACTIVITY-1

Drawing:

- Example:

1. Sentence 1: Rajesh is eating ice cream
2. Sentence 2: A Dog is eating food
3. Sentence 3: That Birch tree is so tall



- The boy represents Rajesh, the dog is from the second sentence and the Birch tree is represented behind Rajesh.



ACTIVITY-2

- Nouns are the names of people, places, animals and things
- So for each of these 4 categories each student will prepare 6 chits per category containing one noun on one paper.
- Now all of these will be collected and folded and mixed together.
- Now each student will pick 24 random chits.
- Now the students will categorize them into the 4 categories of person, place, animals and things.



POST ASSESSMENT

- Ask students to identify 5 nouns from their surroundings
- Students need to write the nouns that they observed from the first point



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
