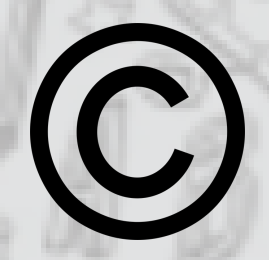

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# GENDER

- In this lesson, children of first grade are introduced to the concept of different forms of gender.
- In English, the four genders of nouns are masculine, feminine, common, and neuter.

Gender	Meaning	Example
Masculine	Refers to words for a male figure or male member of a species	Man, Boy, Horse
Feminine	Refers to female figures or female members of a species	Woman, Girl, Mare
Common	Refers to members of a species that don't specify the gender	Parent, Friend, Student
Neuter	Refers to things that have no gender	Rock, Pencil, Table

- Enables them to understand an object with its name assigning the proper gender.

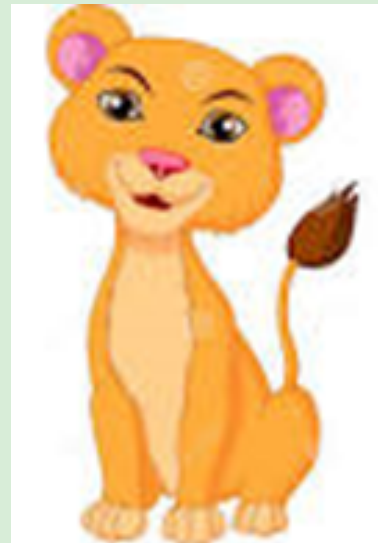




# PRE-ASSESSMENT

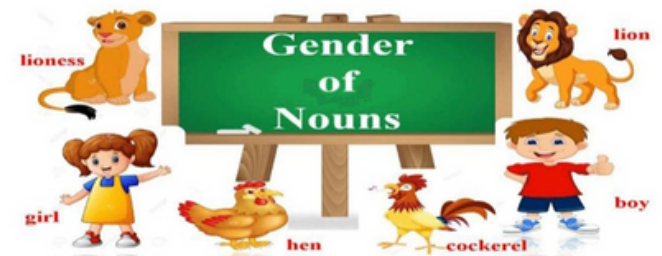
# ACTIVITY-2
