- In this unit, we will explore different types of friendly plants and learn how they can make a positive impact on our world.






FRIENDLY PLANTS


Explain:

Plants give us-

- Food (food grains, fruits and vegetables)
- Oxygen (used by us for breathing)
- Wood (wood is used for building houses)

This picture can be projected for students to see and the teacher explains:





OBJECTIVES



 Students will be able to describe how plants help us and our environment



PRE-ASSESSMENT

- Ask the students if they could name a few friendly plants.
- Ask the students to mention a few benefits of plants in our day to day life.





PRE-REQUISITES



- Blank sheets of paper (for paint and write activity)
- Potato (to cut heart shapes)
- Paint
- Paint brushes





ACTIVITY 1:

- Teacher draws a plant outline on board or on a chart and displays the same
- Each student is given a post-it
- They are instructed to write everything that they know or have learned about plants
- Teacher gives guiding questions to facilitate their thinking
- What are parts of plants, what they need to grow, how plants help us, some examples of plants, etc.





ACTIVITY 1:

- Students take turns to come and paste their post-its on the tree display
- The teacher discusses each point.









ACTIVITY 2:

- Tell your students to write about how plants help humans and animals
- Tell your students to draw a plant using their hand and write about its benefits.
- Observe the below worksheet to do the activity.
- Students create a card, on the cover they draw a plant using their hand, inside they write the benefits (Note: Use your palm to get stem and branches. Cut a heart shape on the potato and use it to paint leaves.)





ACTIVITY 2:

- These can later be displayed in the classroom
- Teachers must help students with spellings, and guide them to think in the right direction. Ensure students work

independently.







POST-ASSESSMENT

Ask the following questions:

- Why are plants important for people and animals?
- Can you think of any ways that you interact with plants in your daily life?







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
